DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Tom Kempenski's play, DUET FOR ONE is an extraordinary "two hander" - a play for two actors - dealing with piercing and difficult issues.

Based loosely on the life of the British cellist Jacqueline du Pré, whose brilliant and promising career was cut short by the onset of multiple sclerosis, DUET explores many things; among them, the relationship between therapist and patient as they navigate their way toward the duet they must learn to play together if they are to succeed in the work before them, and more important, the issue of loss.

How do we cope when all we have worked for and accomplished - all that has defined who we are in the world — is taken from us? How do we go on? Is faith possible when God and nature seem so arbitrary and so cruel?

As with many plays, DUET FOR ONE raises more questions than it answers. And as with most good theatre, for a brief moment in time we get to be immersed in the lives and the dilemmas of other people so that we may question, challenge, affirm and/or alter assumptions of our own.

It is a pleasure to return to the vibrant Milwaukee theatre community to direct this play and to make my Milwaukee Chamber Theatre debut with Michael Wright, Jacque Troy and this exceptional script.
